Our counselors and teachers see children who have some special circumstances and could benefit by random acts of kindness. Perhaps a child doesn't have boots or gloves, or a current backpack is falling apart or there is a special classroom supply need for a student. When there are no other resources to meet this need...E-Angels anonymously donate the item for the child. How does it work? The staff member contacts our E-Angel coordinators (Sue Huck and Janet Coon) about the need. The coordinators send an email to those club members who have volunteered as E-Angels with the request. If someone can fulfill the request, a reply to all email lets all know the request will be handled.
