SMSA presents "Amateurs"

St. Mary's Springs Academy High School will perform the drama "Amateurs" by Tom Griffin on Friday, December 1st and Saturday, December 2nd, at 7 p.m., and on Sunday, December 3rd at 1 p.m. at the Performing Arts Center at Horace Mann High School in North Fond du Lac. A modern play, published in 1991, "Amateurs" is styled as a bittersweet comedy mingled with regret, pain, and hope. Reminiscent of period dramas of the 30's and '40s, most of the nine stereotypical characters are cast members of the Timberly Troupers' musical about undertakers, or the "play within the play".

Cast and friends gather to celebrate opening night at the home of Dorothy and her peculiar husband Charlie. Hilarious interactions give way to mayhem, and comedy blends with psychological trauma and heartache, as the idiosyncrasies of each of the characters are revealed. Dorothy is the warm and compassionate wife of the quietly odd Charlie. She welcomes Nathan, a lonely, shy teacher and ventriloquist, whose dummy Horace will eventually symbolize something different for each character. They are joined by Wayne, who fancies himself a ladies' man, Jennifer, who has Hollywood aspirations, Ernie, a misguided funny man, his wife Irene, who is exasperated by his antics, and Mona, Wayne's former girlfriend. Condescending to review their performances, as a favor to Dorothy, a seemingly pleasant drama critic, Paul, also attends the party. It is after his emergency departure, when the characters accidentally access his unpublished critical review, that they expose their feelings of inadequacy and coping mechanisms.

In the strict sense of the word, an *amateur* is an unpaid participant in a valued activity who is not necessarily unaccomplished. These characters offer memorable insights into human nature and how one survives when harsh realities intrude on one's hopes and dreams.

Directed by Christa Lewis, tickets for the play are \$10 in advance for adults and \$7 for senior citizens at <a href="https://news.ncbi.nlm

Dear Parents,

The students in grades 3-8 at Saint Mary's Springs Academy have created unique and original Christmas cards. These cards will be for sale after all Masses the weekend of December 2nd and 3rd. The cards will be sold for \$2.00 each. All proceeds from the sale will benefit Levi Schwantes.

Levi Schwantes, son of Karissa and Dan, was born with Hypoplastic Left Heart Syndrome. This means that his left atrium and left ventricle are underdeveloped and blood cannot get pumped to his body correctly. Levi has had 2 of 3 open heart surgeries in his first three months of life to re-route the blood flow. He may need more surgeries during his life. He requires very extensive medication, around the clock care, feeding schedule, and many, many appointments at Children's Hospital.

Despite all his challenges, Levi is incredibly loving and happy. He melts the hearts of everybody he meets with his gigantic smile.

All proceeds from the Christmas Card Sale will benefit Levi and go towards medical bills, living expenses for a one-income household, and a savings account for Levi for his future medical expenses that he will have during his lifetime.



Happy 25th Anniversary Elves R Us!



Established in 1992, at St Mary's Middle School on Merrill St., Elves R Us was the brainchild of Leo VanAsten, an 8th grade

student at the time of the newly formed FACES (Fond du Lac Area Catholic Education System), which since has joined with the

high school to make SMSA. Courtney Craig and Trinity Flood are also listed as initial planners. Cheryl Jaeger, Susan Zacherl and Deb Sosinski were the 8th grade team




of teachers that ran the first Elves R Us shop in 1992. An initial \$3,000 investment loan was obtained from National Exchange Bank and Trust to buy the original inventory. The Elves project was an entrepreneurship program that was an initiative in multidisciplinary teaching. Mr. VanAsten's inspiration for "Elves" was a Keeper store that was run at Goodrich High School. In a Keeper store, students worked with senior citizens as their mentors. Thus, Leo and his classmates took this model, changing it to 8th graders mentoring primary students. Mr. Van Asten is now the Executive Director of Rhapsody Arts Center, a non-profit, in Madison.



The Elves shop is available for 3 days. The 8th grade students fill out an application to be part of the event and have an interview prior to getting their jobs. The profit goes to the 8th grade class trip, as well as to buy the inventory for next year. The bulk of the inventory is bought by "shop till you drop" volunteers at post-Christmas, heavily discounted

sales, along with some of it being donated by local

businesses and crafty SMSA supporters. Volunteers also assist with the setup, while the students and 8th grade faculty run the store. Before SMSA came together at our current location, primary students would walk from St Joseph's to St. Mary's to shop in Maurer Hall. Thus, the four flights of stairs today is nothing compared to the blocks they would walk dressed in their winter gear. Many of our students have parents that were previous Elves and shoppers when they were in K-8.

Being a lifeguard is more than just getting a good tan, getting paid, and having fun.

Realistically, as a professional rescuer you are responsible for the safety of the patrons that come to your pool. During this class, not only will there be a great emphasis on water rescue skills, but also on other "behind the scene" skills that are essential to effective lifeguarding.

It is very important that you attend all classes and be on time. We will emphasize the most important points during class time, but we cannot cover every detail. Therefore, it is your responsibility to review all materials that are provided or made available on-line. Also make sure that you bring along paper, a pencil or pen, and your swim apparel to all classes, as well as a lunch.

The prerequisites for taking the class include:

- 1. Swim 300 yards using front crawl and/or breast stroke in a continuous swim with rhythmic breathing and stroke, no touching the bottom of the pool or resting at any time.
- 2. Tread water for two minutes using only leg motion (hands will be placed under opposite armpits.)
- 3. Swim 20 yards, go down 7-9 feet, retrieve a brick, maintain two hands on the brick swimming twenty yards to the starting point and get out of the water without using a ladder.

 Time Limit 1 minute 40 seconds.

The prerequisites must be completed <u>prior</u> to first day of class. Please call the Aquatic Center and make an appointment, 929-3536. Goggles will be allowed during the 300 swim only.

No goggles may be worn during any of the other skill tests.

Perspective candidates must be 15 years of age on or before the final scheduled session of this course. MUST be 16 years old to Guard!
