

- 3. No costumes that depict violence, alcohol, or drugs. Fake weapons are not allowed.

- 5. No religious or political costumes.
- 6. No costumes depicting any SMSA employee, including coaches or volunteers.

Students wearing questionable costumes will be asked to change into normal school attire. If you have any questions regarding the appropriateness of your costume idea, we encourage you to speak to Mr. Smith or Dr. Shively prior to the event.
