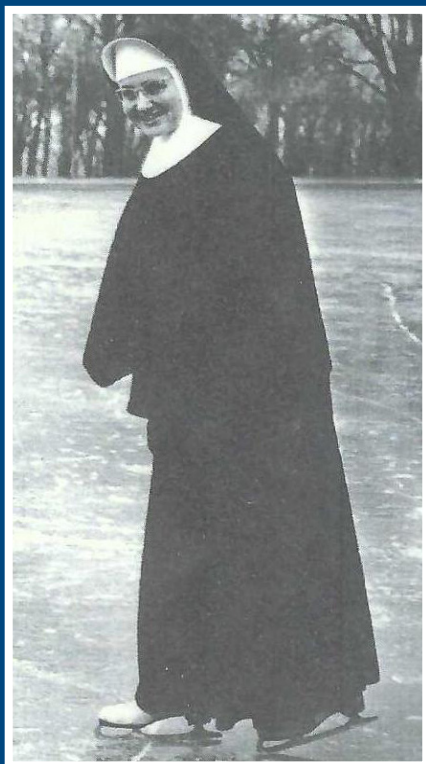
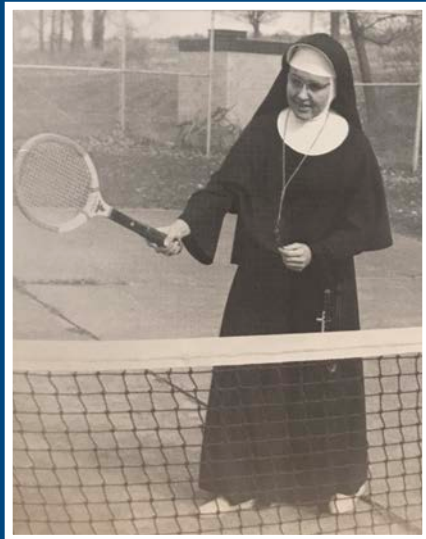

A DAUGHTER IS BORN

On November 2, 1934, in Fort Atkinson, WI, Maryann Magnan was born to Dr. Harold and Mary Magnan. Maryann was an addition that wasn't common for this family, as the many generations born before her were filled with boys. If a daughter were to be born into this family, she'd have to be tough; and tough she was. Maryann spent most of her childhood playing outside with her three brothers and the neighborhood kids. She loved sports of any kind and when given the chance to compete, she was there.

Her love of athletics followed her throughout High School, and upon graduation, she attended UW-La Crosse to pursue a degree in Physical Education. During her first year there, she and her classmates watched the movie "Quo Vadis" and the line, "Where are you going?" really struck a chord. She knew she was being called for something more. The following year, she left UW-La Crosse to begin her journey to join the Congregation of Sisters of St. Agnes (CSA) at the Motherhouse in Fond du Lac. Although she was drawn to a different path, this move did not deter her from finishing her degree. She continued her studies, and in 1958, earned her degree in Physical Education.

A few years following graduation, Maryann made her perpetual profession to be a Sister of St. Agnes, taking the name of Sister Florence Magnan. She recalls, "Not long after my profession, the General Superior sent me to Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska, to study Chemistry." Upon graduation, she was called to teach Chemistry, Biology and General Science at St. Mary's Springs Academy. This was the beginning of an SMSA legacy.

Sister Florence was inducted into the 2019 SMSA Athletic Hall of Fame for her work as a coach, mentor and advocate for girls athletics on the Ledge.

COACH, TEACHER, MENTOR

While on the Ledge, Sister Florence found there was an association for female students allowing them to dabble in athletics. This group was named the Girls Athletic Association (GAA), which included basketball, volleyball, tennis and badminton. Those who participated in this "association" recall it not being much more than an after-school club. In the mid-60s, there were schools in Wisconsin that had similar organizations, but unlike other schools, SMSA was not part of an athletic conference, and therefore never had the opportunity to travel and play competitively in real conference games. SMSA girls would simply play against one another wearing different colored pinnies.

There was an ever-growing number of female students who showed an incredible amount of passion for athletics and Sister Florence knew that something needed to be done so these girls could compete. A few days after this epiphany, as if it were sent from the heavens, Sister Florence received a letter from the Beaver Dam girls organization asking SMSA to join them for a tennis tournament. Sister Florence jumped at the opportunity and drove the girls down to Beaver Dam to compete. During the tournament, she made a point to speak with every single coach in attendance, securing a spot for SMSA in the conference so her athletes would finally have the opportunity to compete in real conference matches. Other schools in the conference included, Lourdes, Xavier, St. Joseph, and even schools as far north as Marinette.

In order to remain competitive in this new conference, Sister Florence knew it was essential to train regularly and obtain the best equipment that could be afforded to them. In the late-60s, SMSA female student athletes shared the gym with the boys. As the school expanded, plans were drawn, updates were made and in 1970 a new gym was built (later known as Hutter Gym). The new gym was built for the boys, while the girls would still have to play in the old, outdated gym...well, let's just say Sister Florence had other plans. One evening, she quietly snuck in and painted volleyball lines on the floor with tempera paint to make sure her girls could equally use the new gym. The school never asked for the lines to be removed and the girls were ecstatic as they now had the same opportunity to use the new gym as the boys.

During her time at SMSA, Sister Florence held the positions of girls athletic director, coach, statistician, equipment manager, bus driver, athletic trainer and teacher...not to mention her most proud role as mentor and advocate for girls athletics. Under her watch, girls athletics went from playing against one another wearing pinnies, to traveling across the state in a bus driven by Sister Florence, and competing in uniforms proudly adorned with an "S" on the front.

Her former player, Terri Sheridan, class of 1975, said, "Sister Florence was an advocate for girls and womens sports long before it was cool to be an athlete. She advocated for Title IX and made sure the girls had the opportunity to compete as Ledgers on the field, court and track. She is remembered by many as simply, Coach, with a whistle on her lanyard, always on the go in her white sneakers." Without a doubt, Sister Florence impacted the lives of many young female athletes.

Her perseverance gave female students an opportunity that may not have otherwise been available. Because of her unwavering dedication to girls athletics at SMSA, female athletes were recognized alongside the boys in the record books. To this day, SMSA has 37 Conference Championships, 35 Regional Championships, 7 Sectional Championships, 11 State Runner-Ups and 6 State Championships in girls athletics including: Cross Country, Tennis, Volleyball, Basketball, Hockey, Soccer, Softball and Track.

After leaving SMSA in 1984, Sister Florence spent the next 30 years at Monroe Clinic/Hospital in Monroe, WI in their therapy department until her retirement in 2014.

Sister Florence is currently retired and living in Nazareth Court, the convent for retired CSA Sisters. Her tireless efforts will remain embedded in the hearts of many.

Simply stated:

**"She did,

"Welcome to Costa Rica!"

I love to travel and believe that when you travel, you get to see and experience the world in a completely different way. When I began teaching at SMSA, I had this dream to take my students to the locations we talked and learned about during class. My hope was that they might experience first-hand what the cultures were all about and why I teach them more than just vocabulary and grammar in their Spanish classes. With the help of a colleague in the New Holstein School District, who has organized and led multiple trips with his students, I connected with WorldStrides, to begin the planning process for a Costa Rican excursion.

During the eight-day visit, my 27 students and eight adults made many wonderful memories from boarding airplanes, some for the very first time, to fly to another country, to zip lining in the rain forest. Every single minute was amazing and challenging for all of us. An important piece of this trip was to visit a local school to bring school supplies for the students. The SMSA students and families were incredibly generous in collecting and donating a variety of supplies, in fact, we collected far more than I could ever have imagined and needed to ask for an additional carry-on suitcase to take all of these gifts to the children!

When the day arrived to visit the school, we were all a bit anxious, not knowing what to expect. *Would our students show how great they were? Would the local children greet us with happiness?* I think each and every one of us was surprised by this visit, local students greeted us with kindness and curiosity.

First, we visited a 1st grade classroom and talked to the children, among whom was a little girl named, *Sophía*. She was happy to see us and tried to speak English as much as she could. Students in public schools are taught English beginning in kindergarten!

While our Ledgers were talking to these children, Mrs. Sales and I went to the teachers' work area to drop off the supplies we had brought along. One of the teachers there told me that they had never before received as many supplies in one visit. They were especially grateful for the numerous packets of loose-leaf.

From there, we all moved to a 6th grade classroom, where local students introduced themselves to us in Spanish, after which, we did the same. That day was also when, Brianna Freund '19, turned 18, and the children in the classroom sang happy birthday to her in Spanish, it was priceless. Finally, our students played a soccer match against the 6th graders, although there was no way our Ledgers could win, they had a great time.

During our bus ride back to the hotel, I overheard students talking about their experiences and about Sofía. I then took the

microphone and shared with them information that I had learned from the school principal. Twenty percent of the students in that school, including Sofía, were orphans. There was silence on the bus, and, after a while, one of our Ledgers said, "but, they were happy," as if until that moment, we all had forgotten that happiness comes from within.

Thankfully, this experience served as a wonderful and real-life reminder to be sincerely grateful for our blessings and that true happiness comes from within. Our next destination is Perú in July 2021. I am very excited for this trip, as we are going to spend nine days in this beautiful country, visiting amazing places including another school, and Machu Picchu, one of the seven wonders of the world according to UNESCO. I know it is going to be another amazing trip with wonderful memories for all of us!



Student reflection, Nicole Tennes '20

Imagine growing up without your parents, in a country with so few resources. When people think of a trip to Costa Rica they think of warm beaches, green plants, and wealthy tourists, but in Costa Rica, I saw the other end. I saw many people who are much less fortunate than the typical person.

At a school there, we met some children who had to grow up without their parents. People should always be thankful for everything they have because some people do not even have a family to love them or rely on.

The main purpose of this service trip was to bring school supplies to the students of a school in Costa Rica. The Spanish Club asked for people to donate supplies. The gently used and new supplies quickly piled up. Our students were very generous with their donations, as we collected many notebooks, loose-leaf paper, markers, pens, and much more. The abundance of supplies would not even fit into just one carry on bag. We had enough donations to fill a second bag. I knew that we were going to be taking the supplies to a school, however, I did not exactly know what to expect. When we arrived at the school, we grabbed the heavy bags and hurried inside. First, we talked with the principal of the school who did not speak English, so there was someone there to translate from Spanish to English. They told us how grateful they were for the abundance of supplies that we donated. We were then

led into a classroom filled with children in first grade, their curious eyes following us as we entered.

I was surprised that there were children from all over Central America and even one child from Florida! Everyone went around the room and said their name and age as well. Then we moved to the grass field next to the school with the students to play soccer for a while. With the hot, bright sun beating down on us, we ran up and down the field. It was so much fun, even though I do not know how to play soccer.

After we said our goodbyes, we got back onto the bus to ride back to the hotel. On our bus ride back we were talking about our experience at the school. Our teacher told us something very shocking...twenty percent of the children at the school were orphans. This surprised me, they seemed like normal, happy kids. I am so thankful for this experience that taught me to be more appreciative of my family and my home. The people that had to go through multiple hardships were so welcoming to us. Even though they had little, they still greeted us with open arms. Our small acts of kindness helped to brighten their days and hopefully improve their school year. Small acts of kindness like this can make a huge impact on the lives of others.

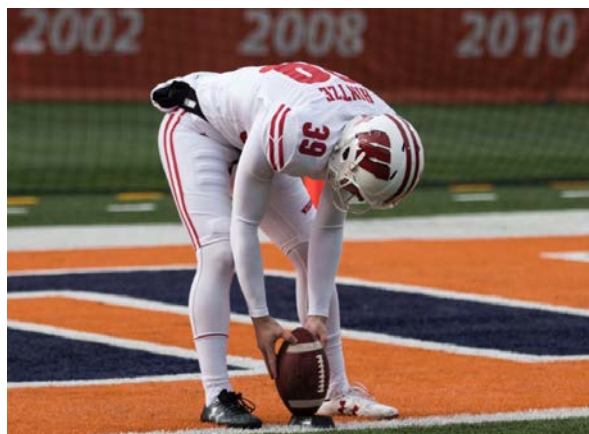
Were you interested in other sports or activities when you were younger?

welcomed eight athletes, two coaches and one honored team on Friday, August 23rd. Inductees shared personal stories of hard work, family support and unbreakable bonds with their former teammates and coaches who helped them reach their full potential.

A number of these stories were centered around the statement, "I, too, was not part of the track team for a couple weeks...until Coach Hyland caught me." For those of you who played for Coach Hyland you'll understand this statement and for those who didn't, let's just say Coach was very adamant that his players also participated in track. Coach Hyland's former players, in attendance, had a great laugh together about their personal experiences attempting to skip track, until Coach found out. They were figuratively "dragged by their ears" down to the track to keep their legs warm during the off season. It should be mentioned, that Nilo Lloren '89, was an exception to this story. Nilo willingly joined track and excelled. His achievements were so great, it filled an entire page in the program, written in size 7 font!

Another great story from the night came from Sean Heaney '77. Sean, a past President of Key Club, recalled a story from his High School years involving a boat motor, the Key Club Vice President, Michael Brandmeier, and the Key Club Treasurer, Gerard Berenz. Sean explained to the crowd that the three of them would host Key Club meetings cruising Lake Winnebago in Sean's brother's boat. One summer afternoon in July of 1976, the starter broke on the boat. The three of them took the boat to Clarence's Marine to fix it and was given the quote of \$37.41. Sean couldn't afford that amount, so he borrowed the money from \$75.00 the Key Club had in their money box. The boat was fixed, and the three continued their planning session on the water. Once school began in the Fall, monthly meetings were held with other members from Key Club and Gerard would give the treasury report. He reported

there was \$75.00 in the account and the members would cheer.

Then Gerard would go on to say \$37.41 of the amount was in the form of a paper IOU. That would cause the members cheers to turn to jeers! Well, 43 years later at the 2019 Hall of Fame event, Sean repaid his IOU, with interest (around 350%!), and presented a check written out to the Key Club.

The evening continued on with hilarious reminiscing from earlier years: from a bus speeding ticket paid off by Sister Florence, poking fun at the athletic dynasty of the Schneiders born in the Holylands, the early years when our opponents would mock us, saying the "S" on the front of our jersey stood for "Sissy," to a police escort out of Madison, WI for our hockey team.

I feel incredibly blessed to share with you that for the second consecutive year, SMSA closed the 2018-2019 fiscal year in a strong financial position. Increasing enrollment, sound financial planning, and budget controls helped to maintain a balanced budget, while our annual fund and special events exceeded the goal, resulting in an opportunity to accomplish some pretty significant things at SMSA! Of course, this is only possible through the generosity and unwavering support of our invested donors, several estate gifts, and high performing special events.

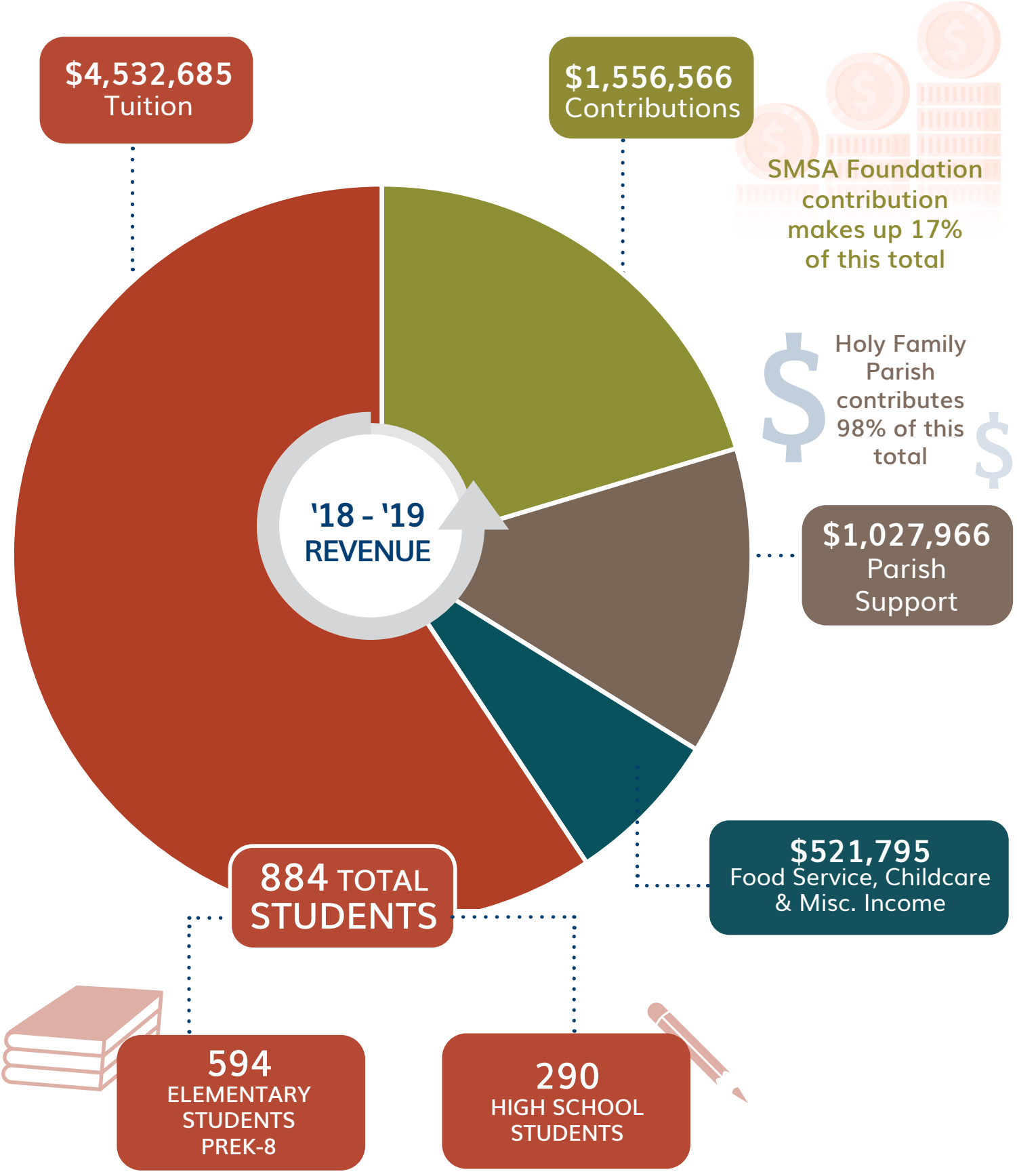
As a result of our fiscal strength, we have been able to:

- Reinvest in the physical campus by increasing classroom space by over 1,700 square feet through the renovation of the 2nd floor storage space. This project was able to increase student capacity and course offerings.
- Invest in 1:1 technology in the High School, thereby placing Chromebooks in the hands of almost 300 students. This, in addition to technology infrastructure updates, ensures enhanced learning opportunities for our students.
- Reorganize the academic model to align with best practices, through deployment of a Principal/Assistant Principal framework, providing leadership consistency and long-term sustainability.
- Implement year one of a three-year faculty wage adjustment based on years of service in the teaching profession and degree attainment. Our eventual goal is to pay teachers 80% (or more) of the public school salary!
- Upgrade Hutter Gymnasium with new floorboards, bleachers, basketball hoops, a fresh coat of paint, and new pads under the basketball hoops.
- Pay for the two new classrooms mentioned above, and pay down a portion of our capital loan for the new campus.

Thank you for all you do to support SMSA and Catholic education. I am truly proud to be called a LEDGER alongside you.

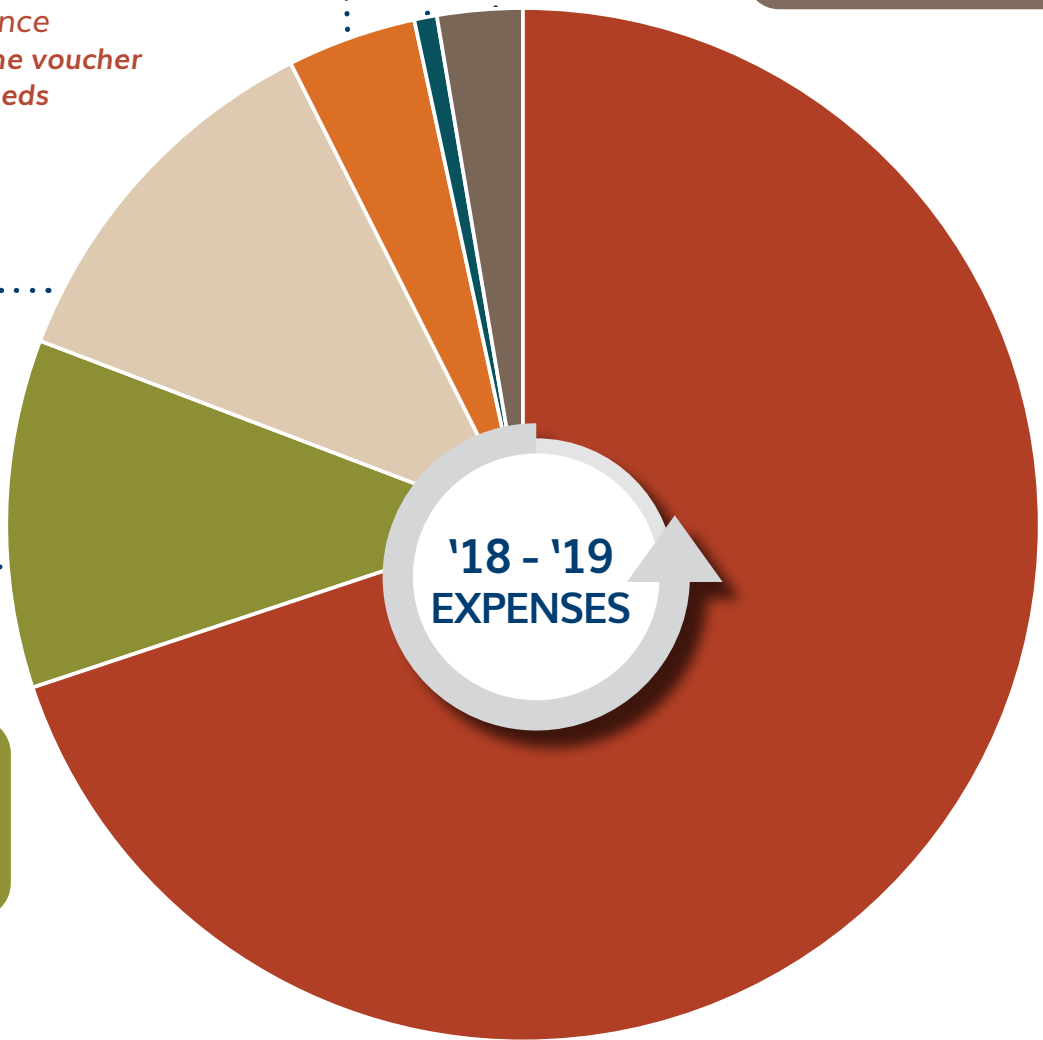

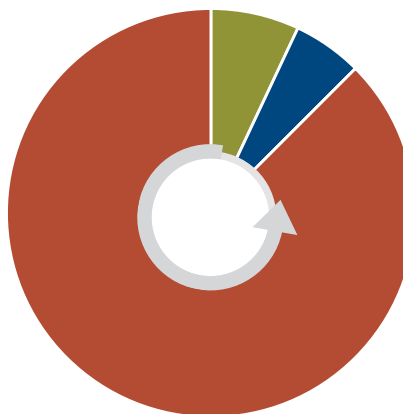

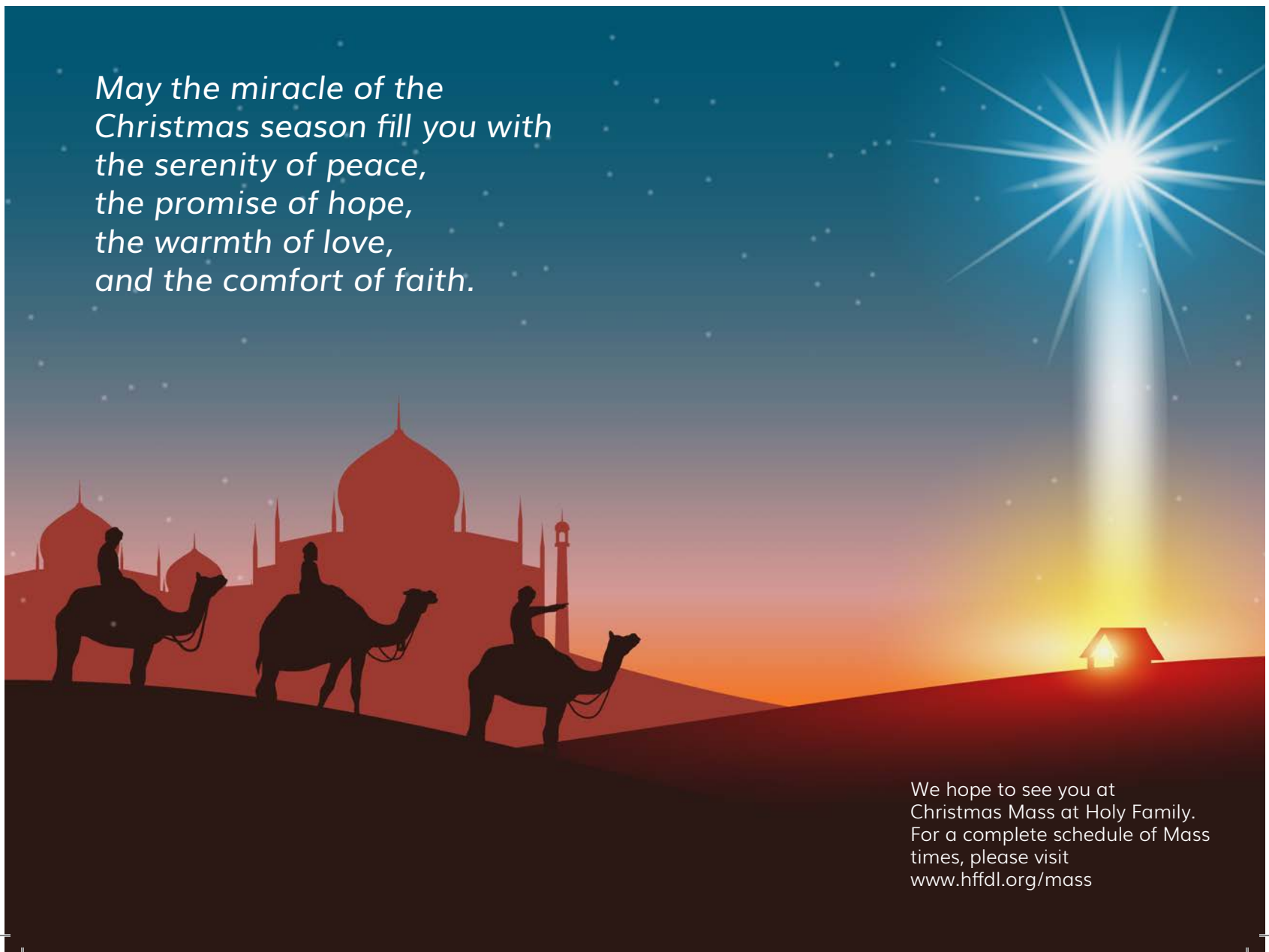
