Hello, my most amazing artists! It has been a joy to work with the many talented artists at the springs! For the month of September, we recognized some amazing artists. Lily B. in kindergarten for her Line Lion. Easton H. for his Crazy Line Hair Portrait. Charlie H. for his Mount Everest collage and Brooklyn Z. for her Line Bird! Great work artists of the month!

This month we finished up our Contemporary Hispanic Artists creations. Kindergarten looked at art work from Mercedes Pardo. They cut shapes out of colors they mixed. They used primary colors to make secondary colors. First grade artists looked at artwork inspired from Xul Solar. They painted a sky background and added block-like shapes from cut paper to create a collage of buildings. Second grade artists looked at art from Lourdes Villagomez. They created a symmetrical butterfly and painted the butterflies using tints of colors, which means they added a color to white. Finally, third grade artists looked at artwork created by Fernando Botero. The used value to color in their Mona Lisa cat! Value means they added dark and light colors to their drawing.

This past month the students have been working on designing the cover of their portfolios! In 4th grade, we discussed The Art Element of Shape and the students used both geometric and organic shapes to design the space around their first and last name. In 5th Grade, we discussed The Art Element of Line and the students used different directions, thicknesses, lengths and types of lines to design the space around their first and last name. In 6th Grade, we have been discussing the 7 Elements of Art (Line, Shape, Form, Color, Value, Texture and Space) and the students designed their portfolio cover to illustrate their understanding of each Element. In 7th Grade, the students designed their portfolio based on a chosen theme. They were asked to incorporate their first and last name into the design of their portfolio. In 8th Grade, we

have been working on one-point perspective techniques. The students used perspective techniques on the front of their portfolio to draw block lettering of a word of their choice. They were then asked to design around the words with imagery related to the words.

Original Works will be coming home at the end of this month. This year's theme is Christmas! Fourth Grade will be creating a Santa and using Folk Art to design their Santa's clothing. We will be using crayon and watercolor to finish their designs. 5th and 6th Grade will be designing their own Christmas Vehicles. They will be adding their own unique designs and details to their vehicles, such as trees, wreaths, and presents. They will be using crayon and watercolor to finish their designs as well. In 7th and 8th Grade, they will be designing their own unique and interesting snowglobe. They will also be using crayon and watercolor to complete their designs.
