COMMUNITY

Located in Fond du Lac, WI; the 15th largest city in Wisconsin, located 64 miles northwest of the metropolitan Milwaukee area.

SCHOOL

Founded in 1909, St. Mary's Springs Academy is a co-educational Roman Catholic Diocesan School (Archdiocese of Milwaukee) serving grades PreK-12. We enroll students from Calumet, Dodge, Fond du Lac, Sheboygan, Washington, and Winnebago Counties who represent 19 Catholic parishes, 20 Christian churches, and several public grade schools.

St. Mary's Springs Academy is accredited by Cognia and is recognized by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction and the National Catholic Educational Association.

St. Mary's Springs Academy uses a modified block schedule. The school day consists of four (4) class periods, each 80 minutes in length. Class periods 1-4 take place on "A" days and class periods 5-8 take place on "B" days. "A" and "B" days alternate during the school week.



CLASS OF 2022 GRADE DISTRIBUTION

St. Mary's Springs Academy does not rank its students. The following GPA ranges are provided to give admission officers a sense of grade distribution and rigor at SMSA for the purpose of transcript evaluation.

The Class of 2023 is divided into the following ranges based on their cumulative GPA after the sixth semester:

Top 10% = ≥ 4.102 (7 Students)
1st Quartile = 3.836 - 4.229 (18 Students)
2nd Quartile = 3.424 - 3.798 (17 Students)
3rd Quartile = 3.10 - 3.381 (15 Students)
4th Quartile = 2.169 - 3.064 (21 Students)
Mid 50% = 3.10 - 3.798 (32 Students)

THEOLOGY DEPARTMENT

Theology courses at St. Mary's Springs are academically demanding. With the goal of forming the student intellectually, spiritually and socially, Theology courses incorporate materials from all the disciplines with a strong emphasis on philosophy. This approach synthesizes the student's learning into a coherent whole. Critical thinking skills, extensive writing, and discussion are integral components of Theology coursework.

GRADING SYSTEM

St. Mary's Springs Academy's grading system is based on four 8-week quarters with two semesters per academic year. The lowest passing grade issued is a "D-". **All grades that are transferable from other high schools/programs will be calculated into a transfer student's cumulative SMSA GPA.**

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Students with a weighted cumulative GPA of 3.8 or better are invited to apply for membership in the National Honor Society at the end of their sophomore year.

Admission to NHS is by invitation only and is selective. Students not selected for membership in NHS at the end of their sophomore year may reapply for membership at the end of their junior year, provided their cumulative GPA remains 3.8 or better.

The **Youth Apprenticeship Program** integrates school-based and work-based learning to instruct students in employability and occupational skills defined by Wisconsin industries and the State of Wisconsin. Students are simultaneously enrolled in academic classes to meet the high school graduation requirements, in a Y/A related instruction class, and are employed by a participating employer under the supervision of a skilled mentor. Through participation in Y/A, students have been able to explore and gain practical experience in fields like health care, business, and the trades.
