Located in Fond du Lac, WI; the 15th largest city in Wisconsin, located 64 miles northwest of the metropolitan Milwaukee area.

<u>SCHOOL</u>

Founded in 1909, St. Mary's Springs Academy is a co-educational Roman Catholic Diocesan School (Archdiocese of Milwaukee) serving grades PreK-12. We enroll students from Calumet, Dodge, Fond du Lac, Sheboygan, Washington, and Winnebago Counties who represent 19 Catholic parishes, 20 Christian churches, and several public grade schools.

St. Mary's Springs Academy is accredited by Cognia and is recognized by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction and the National Catholic Educational Association.

St. Mary's Springs Academy uses a modified block schedule. The school day consists of four (4) class periods, each 80 minutes in length. Class periods
 1-4 take place on "A" days and class periods 5-8 take place on "B" days. "A" and "B" days alternate during the school week.



THEOLOGY DEPARTMENT

Theology courses at St. Mary's Springs are academically demanding. With the goal of forming the student intellectually, spiritually and socially, Theology courses incorporate materials from all the disciplines with a strong emphasis on philosophy. This approach synthesizes the student's learning into a coherent whole. Critical thinking skills, extensive writing, and discussion are integral components of Theology coursework.

GRADING SYSTEM

St. Mary's Springs Academy's grading system is based on four 8-week quarters with two semesters per academic year. The lowest passing grade issued is a "D-". All grades that are transferrable from other high schools/programs will be calculated into a transfer student's cumulative SMSA GPA.

ST. MARY'S SPRINGS ACADEMY GRADING SCALE

Beginning in the 2023-2024 school year, SMSA will use a **weighted grading scale**. Note: Prior to 2023-24, the Grade Percent Equivalent (GPE) was a 7 Point Scale (A Range = 93-100). With the change to weighted grades, a 10 Point GPE was also adopted (A Range = 90-100). When Fall Term 2023 grades are finalized, students' transcripts shall reflect these changes.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Students with a weighted cumulative GPA of 3.8 or better are invited to apply for membership in the National Honor Society at the end of their sophomore year.

<u>Admission to NHS is by invitation only and is selective.</u> Students not selected for membership in NHS at the end of their sophomore year may reapply for membership at the end of their junior year, provided their cumulative GPA remains 3.8 or better.

Students are simultaneously enrolled in a Y/A related instruction class, and are employed by a participating employer under the supervision of a skilled mentor.
